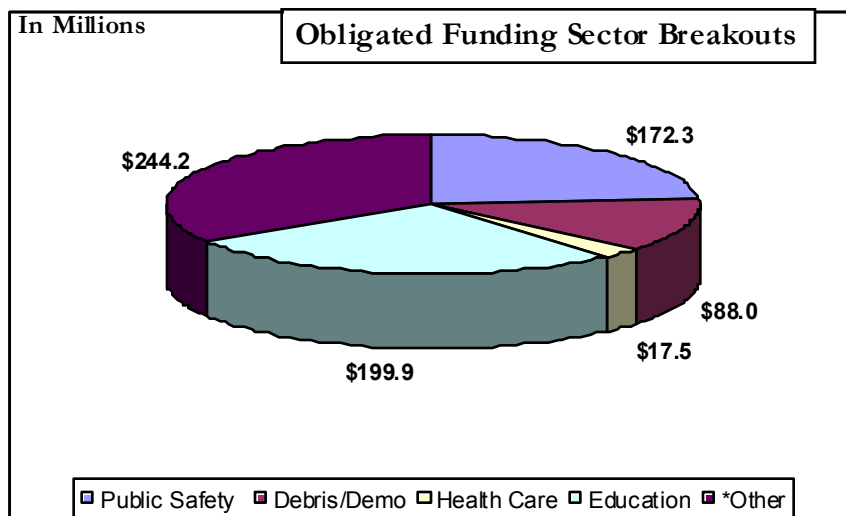
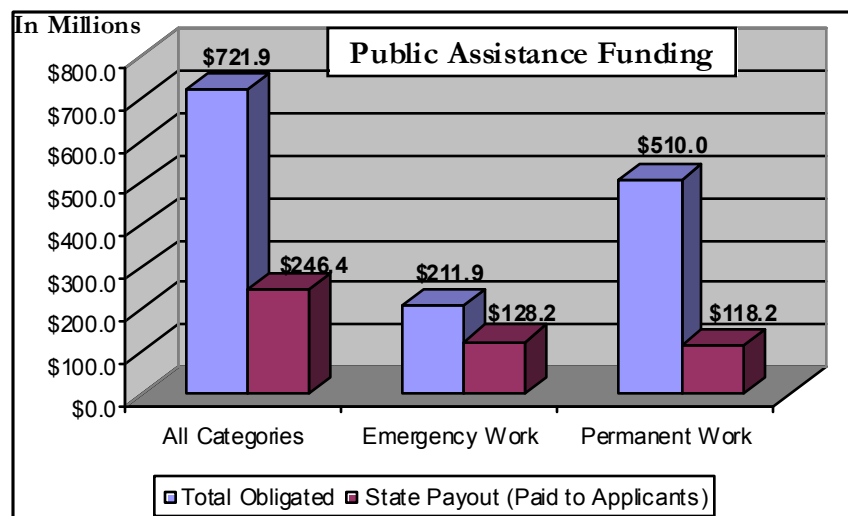


Katrina and Rita Fact Sheet

FEMA Assistance ► Plaquemines Parish

Public Assistance



*Includes sectors such as public utilities, roads and bridges and recreational facilities.

Nearly \$721.9 million in public assistance funding has been provided to date for Katrina and Rita in Plaquemines Parish. A sample of funding includes:

- \$14 million for the consolidation of the Bellaire and Triumph pump stations.
- \$13 million for the replacement of the Plaquemines Medical Center.
- \$8 million for repairs to the Pointe a la Hache Boat Harbor.
- \$4.5 million for repair work at the Buras Auditorium.
- \$3 million for the replacement and elevation of the Buras Library.
- \$6 million for the consolidation of the Davant and Magnolia Community Centers.

Individual Assistance (Individuals and Households Program)

Following hurricanes Katrina and Rita, more than \$134.8 million in Individuals and Households Program funding was approved for 14,665 individuals and families in Plaquemines Parish, including \$91.8 million in housing assistance for rent, repairs and replacement housing and \$43 million in other needs assistance for such things as furniture, clothing and replacement vehicles. At the height of the program, more than 4,670 temporary housing units (travel trailers and mobile homes) were in service in this parish, of which 191 are still occupied.

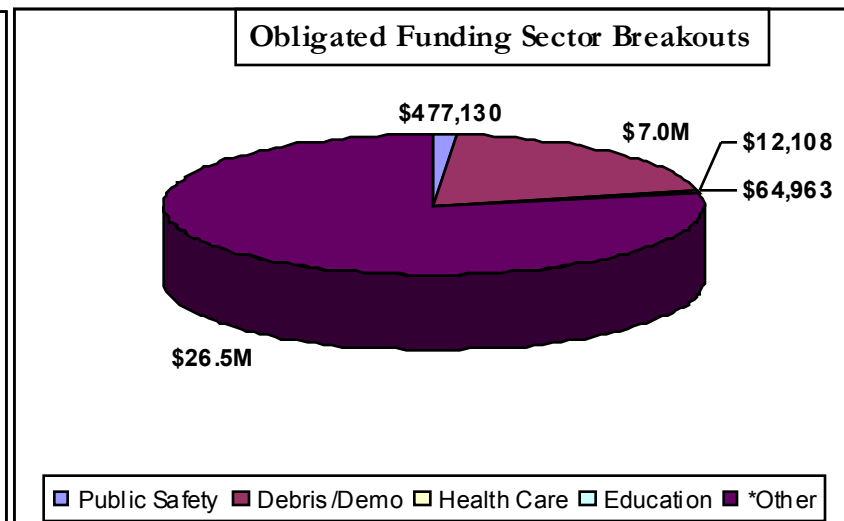
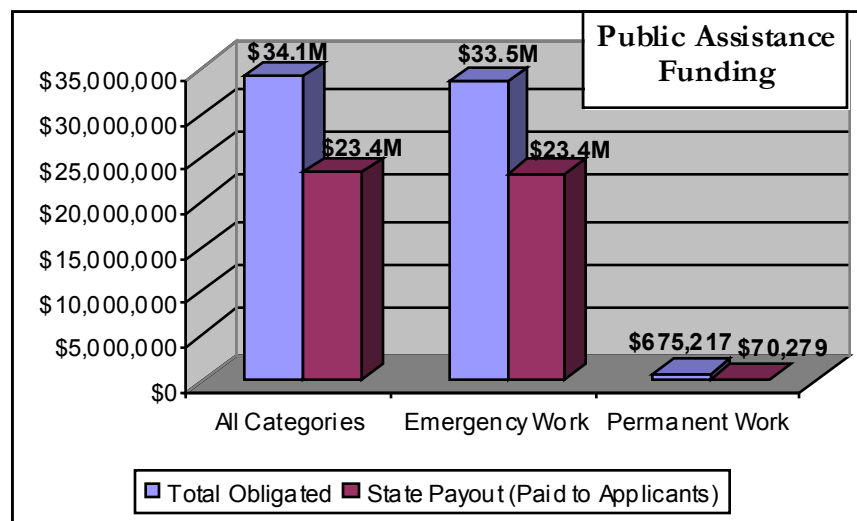
Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP)

Through HMGP, FEMA actively helps prepare Louisiana for future disasters by providing grants to implement long-term solutions for preparedness and protection against property damage and loss of life. Following hurricanes Katrina and Rita, Louisiana was deemed eligible for \$1.47 billion in HMGP funding. Out of 504 statewide projects submitted by the state to FEMA, nine have been approved for Plaquemines Parish, totaling more than \$4.4 million for hazard mitigation projects throughout the area.

Gustav and Ike Fact Sheet

More than \$34.1 million in public assistance funding has been provided to date for Gustav and Ike in Plaquemines Parish. A sample of funding includes:

- \$443,905 for force account labor overtime hours utilized by the parish's Department of Operations to perform emergency protective measures before, during and after Hurricane Gustav.
- \$281,781 for the cost of contracts, materials and rental equipment procured by the Parish President's Office to perform emergency protective measures, such as emergency notifications, navigating flood waters in airboats and removing flood waters with high volume pumps.
- \$182,514 for the cost of contracts, materials and rental equipment procured by the Parish President's Office to perform emergency protective measures, including the boarding up of buildings prior to Hurricane Gustav and the renting of generators following the storm.
- \$695,367 for the Plaquemines Sheriff's Office for force account labor, equipment, and materials associated with their pre- and post-disaster patrol and search and rescue operations.
- \$5.9 million for the restoration of the top of the Braithwaite and Scarsdale levee and other sections damaged from Hurricane Ike's impact.

Individual Assistance (Individuals and Households Program)

In response to hurricanes Gustav and Ike, nearly \$1.3 million in Individuals and Households Program funding has been provided for individuals and families in Plaquemines Parish, including more than \$1 million in housing assistance for rent, repairs and replacement housing and \$243,164 in other needs assistance for such things as furniture, clothing and replacement vehicles.
