COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update

HOLDING STATEMENT

The Plaquemines Parish Government is monitoring COVID-19 (Coronavirus). Residents are asked to monitor local media for more information as it becomes available. The public is advised to take regular CDC (Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) precautions & protective measures at this time.

Monitor and Prepare

You should continue to take measures to prevent the spread of illness, including washing your hands regularly and staying home when you're sick. If you are elderly or have chronic medical conditions, reconsider travel and large public gatherings.

- Stay calm.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water; if that is not possible, use hand sanitizer.
- Cover your mouth and nose with your sleeve or a tissue when you sneeze or cough.
- Avoid close contact (touching or shaking hands) with people who are sick.
- Avoid touching your mouth, nose, and eyes.
- Stay home when you are sick.

April 2, 2020 Misdemeanor Trials have been cancelled and reset to July 2, 2020 at 1:00pm.
April 14, 2020 Criminal Motions have been cancelled and reset to May 12, 2020 at 1:00pm.

Plaquemines Parish Clerk of Court

- Presidential Preference Primary Election in Plaquemines Parish has been moved from April 4th to June 20th and the General Election has also been moved from May 9th to July 25th

Plaquemines Parish Fire/EMS

- Working closely with Plaquemines Parish Government and Department of Homeland Security in following guidelines from Federal and State Agencies as recommended
- Having all personal disinfecting and sanitizing all stations and vehicle as well as safe hygiene practices.
- In the process of procuring additional cleaning supplies and personal protective equipment.

Parish Health Department

- Drafted guidance to all PPG employees on cleaning and sanitizing work stations.
- Communicated with Padua House to determine status and made available to them any resources needed.
- Communicated with local pastor to disseminate guidance on COVID-19 for faith based communities.
- Communicated with LASPCA of plans in case they had a reduced workforce.
- Continue to monitor for any new guidance from LDH/CDC/WHO.

Plaquemines Port Harbor & Terminal District

- PPHTD has put signage for proper hand washing and good hygiene.
- In addition, added hand sanitizer stations at the Port office and all vessels.
- The Port is conducting business as usual. All personnel are expected in to work on Monday unless need to work from home due to school closures.

- We are following the lead of Coast Guard regarding vessel monitoring and security.
- Due to the current situation, we are suspending use of PPHTD vessels to bring USCG Boarding teams to ships effective immediately. In addition we will only make Contact with other Mariners and Vessels in the PPHTD'S DISTRICT on a case by case basis after all the proper agencies have been notified.

Plaquemines Parish Economic Development and Tourism

- Economic development has cleaned and sanitized its offices and vehicle. Also notified our business partners to follow the advice of the Louisiana Dept of Health and CDC

Chevron Oronite – Oak Point Plant

- Local Crisis Management Team activated and meeting routinely.
- Workforce communication sent out regarding prevention and unchanged work schedules.
- Cancelled all employee international business travel.
- Procuring additional sanitizer, cleaning materials, and personal protective equipment.

Alliance Refinery-Phillips 66

- No changes in the operational plans for refinery employees
- Increase cleaning and healthy practices throughout facility
- Sanitizing done numerous times a day

Riverbend Nursing & Rehab

- Facility is closed to all visitors, vendors, providers, etc. (only staff and residents)
- All non-critical appointments for our residents have been rescheduled
- All staff are screened prior to entering the facility
- Daily in services are being provided on infection control, proper hand washing technique, proper technique for application and removal of PPE
- In addition to regular cleaning, common areas and flat services are being disinfected 3x per day using Super Sani-cloth germicidal disposable wipes
- Emergency stock supply has been obtained for most items (exception is masks) and is secure in the event of a facility outbreak
- All departments have stocked up all emergency supplies to prepare for a shelter-in-place event.
